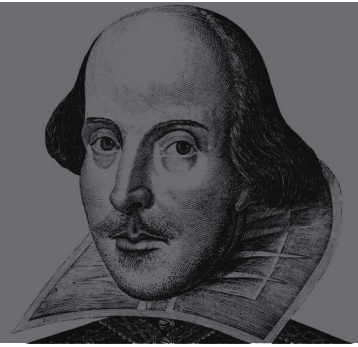




SGCNZ/Bernina Shakespeare Costume Design Competition



Wow with Shakespeare! A chance to win a prize...and have your costume design constructed and displayed at Shakespeare's Globe, London for a month as well as in New Zealand!! The Supreme Winner also has the opportunity of attending SGCNZ's National Shakespeare Schools Production as the Student Costumier and be up for selection as a member of SGCNZ Young Shakespeare Company 2012 to represent NZ at the Globe. (Standard fees for both these will apply.)

In addition to all this, if applicable, your design will also count towards your NCEA assessment.

DESIGN BRIEF

- Design a costume for a character from any Shakespeare play
 - Designs may be contemporary or period in style – though not separated into different categories
 - Sketch your costume design on A3 paper – laminate where possible
 - Attach a rationale of approximately 500 words describing:
 - ~ for which character the costume is designed
 - ~ why you consider your design is appropriate for the character
 - ~ why you chose your particular style
 - ~ the development process behind the design
 - ~ choice of fabrics and a draft budget for materials amounting to no more than \$100
 - ~ instructions on how the costume should be constructed
 - Note: Research, development process, clear description of rationale and construction, fabrics, budget and the design itself are key elements
- Remember that this is a costume for a play and therefore needs to be able to be moved in and potentially have the other characters costumed in an empathetic style

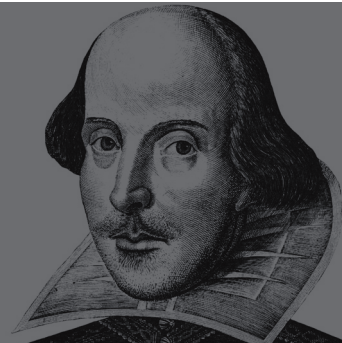
